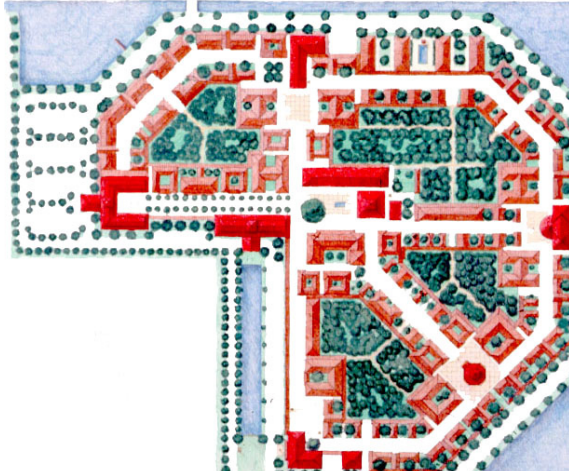


Pathways

The Pathways project was a submission to an invited competition sponsored by the Miami Jewish Home and Hospital for the Aged for a new facility in Broward County, Florida. The goal of the design was to find new and innovative ways to meet the growing needs of long-term care for the elderly, particularly those afflicted with Alzheimer's Disease.

The 35-acre site is located in a poorly defined suburban area surrounded predominantly by apartment blocks and towers. The chosen solution creates a campus by unifying the various programmatic requirements in the form of a village. The site is composed of neighborhoods connected by walkable, shaded streets that terminate in public squares. The squares are defined by a hierarchy of public buildings and a variety of housing facilities, each offering varying degrees of patient care. Living accommodations for the caregivers, nurses, and administrative staff members are also located within the village.
